

## **Installing Millett Picatinny rifle mounts**

## \*\*\*MAKE SURE WEAPON IS UNLOADED BEFORE STARTING\*\*\*

- 1. Remove filler screws on top of rifle receiver, if installed.
- 2. Clean holes. Best to remove any oil or grease from screw holes using alcohol or solvent...
- 3. As the Millett Picatinny rifle mount is made to exacting standards, and there may be slight errors in the hole placement of the rifle, it is best to start each of the screws in the threads first, having all 4 screws in place before tightening them. PHOTO A

Note: The use of thread locking glue such as loc-tite prevents the screws loosening over time. PHOTO B

- 4. Tighten each of the screws starting from one end to the other end of the rail and then tighten the middle screws. Each screw should be firmly tight, approximately 60-70 inch pounds. PHOTO C
- 5. With the Millett Picatinny rail it is possible to mount a wide range of scopes and optics, as the optic device can be mounted at any point on the rail using standard Weaver type rings. Due to the added height of the Millett Picatinny rail, scopes with large bells can be mounted using low or medium rings and still clear the barrel.
